01 SET YOUR TIMELINE

Once you're engaged, it can be easy to want to start on all of the exciting parts of planning your wedding. But shopping for a wedding gown before deciding on when you're getting married, or before setting a budget for the big day can be a dangerous game.

Most of our wedding dresses take 6-8 months to order and need an additional 2-3 months for alterations.

If you're planning a short engagement, some dresses may not be available for you to special order or may come with rush fees.

We recommend shopping 9-12 months before your wedding, but ultimately the right timeline for finding your gown is whatever feels right to you. We are here for you when the moment to find your dream dress comes.

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04 PICK YOUR ENTOURAGE - CAREFULLY

Nobody wants to deal with a negative nelly. It's hard for the people who love you most to not share their opinions with you and with multiple people, there will be multiple opinions.

Limit your guests to only the most important decision makers. Ask yourself: does this person need to be with me to make the decision? If the answer is no, wait to share the dress excitement with them on the wedding day, during the dress pickup, or in an accessories appointment.

If the answer is yes, wait to set up your appointments until they are available to join you.

05 BE PREPARED TO SAY 'YES'

Some brides feel they need to 'pre-shop' or visit multiple boutiques before they decide on the one.

Setting rules and limitations on your shopping experience can be more destructive than helpful in your quest for the perfect dress.

Shopping before they are with you can take away from the experience for when they are finally able to join you.
